Route Rail Passengers to San Diego Via Los Angeles

Passenger Service Discontinued Via The San Diego & Arizona Eastern Railway Between San Diego and El Centro, Calif.

Effective January 12, 1951, Trains 362 and 363, between San Diego and El Centro, Calif., were discontinued. There is now no regular passenger service available between these points via the San Diego & Arizona Eastern Railway.

Also discontinued were through San Diego-Chicago Standard Sleeper and Chair Car which operated via the Imperial, Trains 39 and 40.

> Passengers destined to San Diego should be routed via Los Angeles, where convenient transfer to other rail service is available.

Free Side Trip to San Diego

On one-way and round-trip tickets from the Middle West, East and South to California, passengers may include San Diego for not one cent extra rail fare.

Fine service from Chicago to Los Angeles is available on the streamlined Golden State and (via San Francisco) on the City of San Francisco and Overland. Also, from New Orleans to Los Angeles on the new, streamlined Sunset Limited. Convenient connection may be made at Los Angeles Union Passenger Terminal with frequent service between Los Angeles and San Diego via other rail service.
